

The Cal Coast Cares Foundation is proud to announce an educator grant program that provides educators in K-12 public, private or charter schools, community and state colleges/universities in San Diego or Riverside counties with monetary support for class projects in any of the STREAM fields (Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts, and Math).

## Eligibility Guidelines:

Grants ranging from \$500 - \$2500 are awarded for projects that have clear objectives, a strong evaluation component and indicate heavy student involvement with a goal of enhanced learning outcomes. The following are applicant and project eligibility requirements:

- 1. Grant applicant must be teaching in K-12 public, private or charter schools, community or state colleges/universities in San Diego or Riverside counties.
- 2. Grant applicants can request \$500 \$2,500 to support their STREAM related project.
- 3. A maximum of two (2) teachers from the same school will be eligible to receive funding within the same application period.
- 4. Project must:
  - Be STREAM related (Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts, or Math) for class projects
  - Demonstrate a clear and compelling need
  - State well-defined, measurable, and realistic objectives and goals
  - Have a detailed budget for the project
  - Lead teacher must provide evidence of teaching experience and knowledge of the project subject matter
- Cal Coast Credit Union employees and their family members, and Cal Coast volunteer officials are not eligible for grant funding.
- 6. Funds can be used to purchase equipment or project materials, but cannot be used for the following:
  - Routine school supplies such as: pens, pencils, glue, markers or paper
  - Field trip expenses
  - Food or prize expenses
  - Transportation costs
  - Teacher salaries, compensation and/or incentives
  - Teacher training/development program expenses
- 7. The award will be determined by the Grant Awards Committee appointed by the Cal Coast Cares Foundation Board. Awardees will be notified no later than November 30, 2024.
- 8. Applications must be completed and submitted online via DocuSign no later than October 7, 2024, p.m. PST. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
